



CVCH teams continue to support West Midlands Police in identifying and evidencing criminal activity. For example on Thursday 15th November 2018 CVCH CCTV alerted Police to suspicious activity that was taking place on Farnborough Road, Castle Vale, at around 2.30pm.

Due to the quick response of CVCH CCTV and West Midlands Police, on the 16th November, two Castle Vale residents and a further two perpetrators from outside of Castle Vale were charged with a number of offences. The perpetrators altogether were charged with conspiracy to possess a sawnoff shotgun, possession of a bladed article, possession of cocaine with intent to supply and cannabis production. Great partnership working within Castle Vale has meant that some serious offenders have been taken off the streets along with dangerous weapons and drugs.

These arrests more than likely prevented a further serious incident and we thank all those involved in the arrest for making this happen and making Castle Vale that little bit safer. If you suspect any suspicious behaviour please ensure you

PLAN TO DO BETTER ON THE VALE

The vision is to create stronger, healthier and happier communities with opportunities for residents to access learning and skills, improve employment prospects, to have a quality home in a sage and green neighbourhood.

On 14 September 2018 Jack Dromey MP (Chair of the Neighbourhood Partnership) and Sharon Thompson (Cabinet Member for Housing and Neighbourhoods) officially launched the new Castle Vale Neighbourhood Plan 2018 – 2030.



WAGTAIL WALK BIKE PATH

Following major works to Spitfire Island undertaken in 2015 a screening bund was built next to the terraces off Cadbury Drive, Castle Vale. The cycleway forms part of the Wagtail Walk, and initiative developed by Jez Lilley back in 1994. Wagtail Walk is a 15km long network of pathways that surrounds and cuts across Castle Vale, offering pedestrian access to shops and amenities and a great opportunity to exercise.

The original cycle path off Cadbury Drive has now been reinstated enabling cyclists to use again this section of Wagtail Walk. Care was also taken to ensure that residents can safely access their homes.



Residents will have seen the silver last leaf tree on the flank of the Pioneer Group. This was produced by a local artist who was one of the original architects when the estate was transformed by the Housing action trust in the 90s. The idea is that the community can nominate those that have passed away who have made a real contribution to Castle Vale and their names will be included on one of the leafs. Additional funding was provided by the Endowment Trust Fund to erect a plaque to enhance the tree and create more spaces for future residents to be recognised.



THERE BUT NOT THERE

This year's

Remembrance Sunday fell on 11 November and coincided with 100 years since the Armistice brought to an end the First World War. There were poignant tributes around the country, not least, here in Castle Vale. Through support from the Pioneer Group, we were able to participate in a national art project featuring transparent silhouettes of First World War soldiers that have been placed all around the country.

The project aims to commemorate, educate and heal and has raised much-needed funds for a number of combat charities, including Help For Heroes.

Our 'Tommy' spent the first part of Remembrance Week at Greenwood Academy, where pupils took part in a project to create postcards of remembrance for those who fought or have been involved in wars our country has faced.

On Remembrance Sunday itself, Tommy transferred to St Cuthbert's church for the Service of Remembrance, including the official laying of wreaths of poppies in the Garden of Remembrance behind the Church. On 12 November, he travelled to Phoenix Court for a further service to mark the centenary of the armistice and where it is hoped he will be able to be permanently installed as a reminder of the key messages of the 2018 Remembrance commemorations.
